Jesus gave us an example of persistence in prayer

And He said to them, "Which of you shall have a friend, and go to him at midnight and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves; Luke 11:5 NKJV

for a friend of mine has come to me on his journey, and I have nothing to set before him'; Luke 11:6 NKJV

and he will answer from within and say, 'Do not trouble me; the door is now shut, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot rise and give to you'? Luke 11:7 NKJV

I say to you, though he will not rise and give to him because he is his friend, yet because of his persistence he will rise and give him as many as he needs. Luke 11:8 NKJV

So I say to you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. Luke 11:9 NKJV

For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened. Luke 11:10 NKJV

Jesus gave us an example of our good Father in prayer

If a son asks for bread from any father among you, will he give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will he give him a serpent instead of a fish? Luke 11:11 NKJV

Or if he asks for an egg, will he offer him a scorpion? Luke 11:12 NKJV

If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him!" Luke 11:13 NKJV

Memory Verse: "God Watches Over Us" Psalm 121 (Adapted for Toddlers)

Heart of the Lesson: God Watches Over Us Wherever We Are

Parent Connect: Go for a walk as a family. Take the "binoculars" that your toddler made in class today. As you walk, let your toddler use the "binoculars" to look around and find things (Like I Spy.) When you are almost home, say: Who is watching over us right now? Remind your toddler that God is watching over us wherever we are.



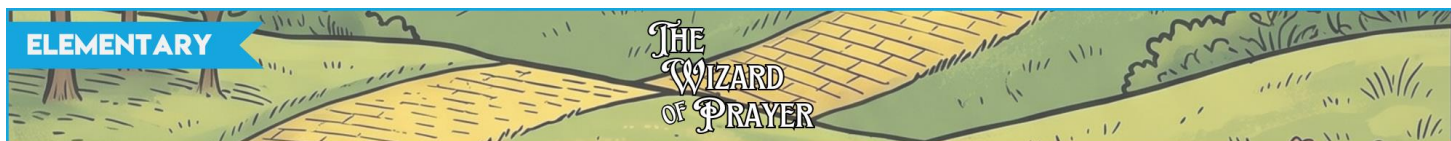
This month, during our busy SBO season, we are taking a break and learning about spiritual truths through watching VeggieTales

Parent Connect: Today we talked about Luke 11:2 and God's kingdom that is coming. Go on a walk in your neighborhood as a family and pray this verse over your neighbors, and school. “Father, hallowed be your name, YOUR kingdom come.”
