WE CAN TALK TO GOD HANNAH PRAYS



In this series, we learn about how Samuel heard from God when he was just a boy, and how Samuel answered God!

Memory Verse: "Pray about Everything" Philippians 4:6a (adapted for toddlers)

Heart of the Lesson: We can talk to God in our Prayers

Parent Connect: sing today's activity sheet, help your toddler retell the story of Samuel hearing God's voice. Have your toddler put the Samuel cut out in and out of bed each of the three times that he hears God's voice



In this series we will learn about Moses from birth, to parting The Red Sea, and all the trials that he and the Israelites went through as God led them to the Promised Land.

Memory Verse: "This is my command - be strong and courageous! Do not be afraid or discouraged. For the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." Joshua 1:9

Heart of the Lesson: Stories of Moses | Exodus 2-14

Parent Connect: Today we learned about stories of Moses, from when he was a baby to when he parted the Red Sea. God had a plan the while time, leading Moses through many things. Sit down with your kid and draw out a plan that God may want for their life. Start by drawing a picture of them as a baby, what they look like now, and what they think they will look like when they are grown up.



Jesus wants to be our best friend, but He also wants us to have friendships on earth too. In this series we want to show our kids how to be a good friend, find a good friend and examples of different kinds of friendships in the Bible.

Memory Verse: "Two people are better off than one, for they can help each other succeed. If one person falls, the other can reach out and help. But someone who falls alone is in real trouble." Ecclesiastes 4:9-10

Heart of the Lesson: Friends have each other's back - 1 Samuel 18:1-4, 19:1-7, 20

Parent Connect: Ask your kids about a friendship they have. What does it mean to have your friends back? Has there ever been a time you have stood up for a friend? Share a time with your kids you stood up for one of your friends.



On promotion Sunday we talked about how we shouldn't let people look down on us because of our youth as we looked 1 Timothy 4:12. In this series, we will explore that idea further and dive into what discipleship looks like as a 5th or 6th

grader. This month in G56 we are learning about what it means to be a disciple, Jesus' example of discipleship, and two examples of discipleship from the Bible.

Memory Verse: "Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Matthew 28:19-20

Heart of the Lesson: What does it mean to be a disciple? - Jesus calls us to follow Him – 1 Timothy 4:12, Luke 5:10-11, 27-28, Luke 9:23-27, Mark 8:35

Parent Connect: Jesus' strategy was to make disciples who make disciples. As a parent, you are discipling your kids. Talk with your kids about how you've been discipled or how you disciple others.

When we are followers of Jesus, we aren't meant to grow in our relationship with Jesus alone! We can honor God by letting other people help us grow in our faith, and responding by helping others grow in their faith too. This is called DISCIPLESHIP. Memory Verse: You have heard me teach in front of many witnesses. Pass on to people you can trust the things you've heard me say. Then they will be able to teach others also. (2 TIMOTHY 2:2 NIRV)

Heart of the Lesson: We are called to lead spiritually like Jesus!
