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This month we are learning that Jesus is alive, and that He loves us! We are learning the Easter story and how Jesus raised from the dead for us!

Memory Verse: “Jesus is Alive” Mark 16:6B (Adapted for Toddlers)

Heart of the Lesson: Jesus is Alive & Cares for Us

Parent Connect: In today’s lesson we learned that Jesus is Alive! We talked about when the angle rolled the stone away from Jesus’ tomb that it was empty. Using today’s craft, let your kid retell the Easter story! Use the rock on a popsicle stick like a puppet. Help your kid move the rock away while you both say, Move that rock! Jesus is alive! Point out that Jesus isn’t in the tomb! The tomb is empty! Jesus is alive!



In this series we will learn about Jesus teachings, His miracles, His death and resurrection. We will wrap up with Jesus’ ascension as He goes to Heaven. Through the series, we will learn each story shows us how Jesus loves us and how Jesus is the perfect example of how we should love others!

Memory Verse: “For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life.” John 3:16 (NLT)

Heart of the Lesson: Jesus Clears the Temple | Luke 19:28-48

Heart of the Lesson: When We Spend Time with God, We Participate in Outreach - Ephesians 1:3

Parent Connect: Ask your kids what is something that stuck out to them about St. Patrick. Think about who your family could reach out to and share Jesus with.



Did you know that there are more than 50 commands of how Christians should treat one another in the New Testament? In this series, we will be exploring the different “one another” passages to discover what it looks like to be in the body of Christ.

Memory Verse: “So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should love each other.” John 13:34

Heart of the Lesson: As Christians, we are called to forgive one another – Ephesians 4:32

Parent Connect: Pray with your student for someone who they are struggling to forgive, or someone who is struggling to forgive them.

This series, we’re looking at what the Bible says about how we can love one another well so that we know Jesus better too.
