Then Zacchaeus stood and said to the Lord, "Look, Lord, I give half of my goods to the poor; and if I have taken anything from anyone by false accusation, I restore fourfold." Luke 19:8 NKJV

And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because he also is a son of Abraham; Luke 19:9 NKJV

for the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost." Luke 19:10 NKJV

### Like Zacchaeus, Jesus called us to open the door to Him

Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with Me. Revelation 3:20 NKJV

### Like Zacchaeus, we did nothing to deserve God's amazing grace

For when we were still without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly. Romans 5:6 VNKJ

Heart of the Lesson: The Bible is our instruction manual for life! | Ephesians 4

Parent Connect: The Bible gives us lots of instructions on how to live our lives. Grab your Bibles and look up the following verses: Exodus 20:1-17, Luke 12:31, Matthew 22:36-39 Talk as a family about how you can apply these verses to your lives and how they act as our instruction manual for life.

Grace is God giving us what we don't deserve: kindness, forgiveness, and a place in His family. In this series, we'll learn how to see grace the way that God does. We will explore what grace looks like, how it shows up in the Bible, and how it changes our everyday lives.

**Memory Verse:** "God saved you by his grace when you believed. And you can't take credit for this; it is a gift from God." Ephesians 2:8

Heart of the Lesson: God's Grace to Zaccheus: Salvation - God's grace saves us. (Luke 19:1-11)

Parent Connect: Invite your student to share a moment when they realized they needed help or a second chance. Discuss how God's grace meets us where we are, even when we feel far from Him. Encourage your family to think about ways they can point someone toward Jesus or show grace to someone struggling with mistakes or rejection.
