GOD IS STRONG

CROSSING THE RED SEA



In this series, we learn about the crossing of the red sea and how strong God is!

Memory Verse: “God is Strong and always ready to help.” Psalm 46:1 (Adapted for Toddlers)

Heart of the Lesson: God is strong and can do anything

Parent Connect: Today we made a “Red Sea Sensory Bag.” Ask your toddler to show you how to “part the Red Sea” just like in our Bible story. (use the sides of your hands to squish the gel out of the middle of the bag and pile it on the two sides). As you play together with the “red sea sensory bag” discuss the story with your toddler. Don’t forget to remind your toddler that “God Is strong and can do anything.”

IN THE BEGINNING

A WALK THROUGH GENESIS



In this series we will learn about God’s Creation of all things, the fall into sin by Adam and Eve, and further on to Abram’s calling from God. Learning about big stories in the book of Genesis.

Memory Verse: O Sovereign LORD! You made the heavens and earth by your strong hand and powerful arm. Nothing is too hard for you! Jeremiah 32:17

Heart of the Lesson: Adam and Eve Fall Into Sin | Genesis 3

Parent Connect: Today we learned about how Adam and Eve made bad choices and had bad consequences. Adam and Eve’s bad choices led to them having to leave the Garden of Eden. At the dinner table, have everyone take a turn saying a decision, ex., using kind words, taking a toy from a friend, etc. Using thumbs up or thumbs down, decide together if that would have a good or bad consequence.

Memory Verse: “Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up. And let us run with endurance the race God has set before us” Hebrews 12:1

Heart of the Lesson: We can learn from the spiritual “athletes” that have gone before us. - Hebrew 11, Emphasis on Hebrews 11:33-34

Parent Connect: Watch the opening ceremony and talk about what the athletes must be feeling. Ask your kid who is someone in the Bible they can learn from.

In the Bible there are many examples of stormy weather, which can also represent the hard times in our lives. Memory Verse: “I will call to you whenever I’m in trouble, and you will answer me.” Psalm 86:7

Heart of the Lesson: Peter Walking On Water: Jesus is with us in the storm - Matthew 14:22-33

Parent Connect: Take time as a family to listen to the song, “Praise You In This Storm” by Casting Crowns. Talk about the lyrics together as a family.
