Sight: Science & Spiritual Truth


We can learn about God/spiritual world by studying science/physical world

For since the creation of the world <u>His invisible attributes are clearly seen</u>, being understood <u>by the things that are made</u>, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse, **Romans 1:20 NKJV**

Sight = ability of the eyes to detect light & send signals to the brain

What can we learn about God by studying sight?

Sight = complex & intricate design of the eye



Irreducible complexity

There is a God & He created us

The hearing ear and the seeing eye, The LORD has made them both. Proverbs 20:12 NKJV

He who planted the ear, shall He not hear? He who formed the eye, shall He not see? **Psalm 94:9 NKJV**

Sight = requires light




We need God (the Light) to be able to see things spiritually

But as it is written: "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, Nor have entered into the heart of man The things which God has prepared for those who love Him." **1 Corinthians 2:9 NKJV**

But God has revealed them to us through His Spirit. For the Spirit searches all things, yes, the deep things of God. **1 Corinthians 2:10 NKJV**

Sight = field of view of 200° x 130°




We are limited in what we see spiritually

while we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen are temporary, but the things which are not seen are eternal.

2 Corinthians 4:18 NKJV

For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part, but then I shall know just as I also am known. **1 Corinthians 13:12 NKJV**

Sight = center vs. periphery of the retina



God designed us to focus on one thing spiritually

looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. **Hebrews 12:2 NKJV**

This month, we are learning that God sees us. God sees us in our Good times and our bad. This month we will be looking at the story of Jonah and talking about how God could see Jonah even when he ran away. God loves us and God sees us.

Memory Verse: "God Sees Us. Job 31:4 (adapted for toddlers)

Heart of the Lesson: God Sees Us All The Time

Parent Connect: Ask your toddler why we made a boat as our craft today. Does he/she remember who we learned about today? Remind your toddler that we learned about Jonah. Jonah ran away from God. Ask your toddler, "Who could still see Jonah even when he ran away?"

HEROES OF FAITH

This series introduces kids to five major leaders from the Bible- Abraham, Moses, Joshua, David and Elijah- each chosen by God to lead his people with courage and faith. Through their stories, kids will learn about trusting God, standing up for what's right, and following God's direction even when it's hard.

Heart of the Lesson: Summary of Moses, Joshua and David

Parent Connect: Today we learned about Joshua, David and Moses. Find some library books or stories online about each of these men to check out this week and read them to your kid!



Our heart is for kids to know you can believe in Jesus AND love science. God's Creation is His picture book to better understand spiritual things including who He is. In this series we will see how light pictures Jesus and how eyesight teaches us about how to spiritually see.

Heart of the Lesson: Physical sight teaches us about spiritual sight

Parent Connect: Our physical sight is limited to what's right in front of us and sometimes our spiritual sight can be limited in the same way. Talk with your kids about what spiritual sight is and how we can pause in moments when we don't see what's around the corner and trust that God will help us.

SCIENCE & TRUTH



Science helps us understand the world God made, but it also points us to something even greater: spiritual truths about who God is and who we are. We will explore these truths by looking at light; we'll discover how light shows the glory of God as we engage with light in scripture, sight; we will learn how our eyes see the glory of God through in His creation and in spiritual matters, and vision; we will learn how our vision is interpreting what we see and that our spiritual vision should reflect the glory of God. Seeing the world through God's eyes is what One Vision is all about. It helps us focus on what matters most to Him.

Memory Verse: "For ever since the world was created, people have seen the earth and sky. Through everything God made, they can clearly see his invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature. So they have no excuse for not knowing God." Romans 1:20

Heart of the Lesson: Our eyes see the glory of God Proverbs 20:12, Psalm 139:14, Psalm 94:9, 1 Corinthians 2: 9, 10, 14, 2 Corinthians 4:18, Philippians 4:8, Romans 1:20

Parent Connect: Some people know right away they need glasses. Others don't realize it until an eye exam shows **things are a little** blurry. That's kind of like how we see spiritual truth - some people are aware they need God's help to see clearly, while others need someone to help point it out to them. Talk as a family: Have you ever realized you were seeing something wrong, physically or spiritually? What helped you see more clearly?
